How to Use

These files are very simple to install. You won't have to move and rearrange any of the files on the CD; you just copy your CD to your HD and leave them as is. Add my one file and one folder and that's it. Takes about two minutes to setup. Because no PDF files are moved, you can continue to use the MB indexing system at the same time, if you want.

Note: These index files were set up using the Mercedes-Benz Service Manual disk. If you don't have the Model 107 MB Service Library CD, it is available from various places, including MB-USA, 1-800-FOR-MERCEDES.

NOTE to PC users: MS Internet Explorer has a bug that does not allow the proper functionality of the pull down menus, which will allow you to navigate directly to certain points in some PDF files. We suggest that you use Netscape or Mozilla for proper display.

Installation Instructions

It's pretty simple. Here is all you do:

1. Expand the file, R107.zip.
It will uncompress into a folder named "R107". Inside of "R107" will be my main index file,

named "Main.html" and a folder named "Index" which contains all of the rest of my stuff. Also in "R107" is an empty folder named "r107CD1".

2. Insert your Model 107 CD into your computer.
From your CD, drag the "Program" folder in the CD into the "r107CD1" on your hard drive.
NOTE: if your CD has no "Program" folder, create a "Program" folder in "r107CD1" and drag ALL files from CD into it.
3. After all the files have copied, Eject CD disk.
4. Move the "R107" folder to wherever you want on your HD.
This could be your Documents folder, for example. Don't move any files around inside the R107 folder unless you know what you are doing. You could break links.
5. There is no Step 5.

That's all that there is to it. So now the set up should be:



To run, just open the "Main.html" file in your browser. You can bookmark this page as your starting point.

So now, with this, you can use my Index system OR the MB html/flash files.

Please let me know if you are having trouble making it work. I hope that you all find the Index an improvement to the CD experience and I also hope that you will let me know if/when you get it to work. Also, if you have any questions or suggestions for improvement, please let me know - constructive criticism is welcome and will never hurt my feelings! ;-)
